

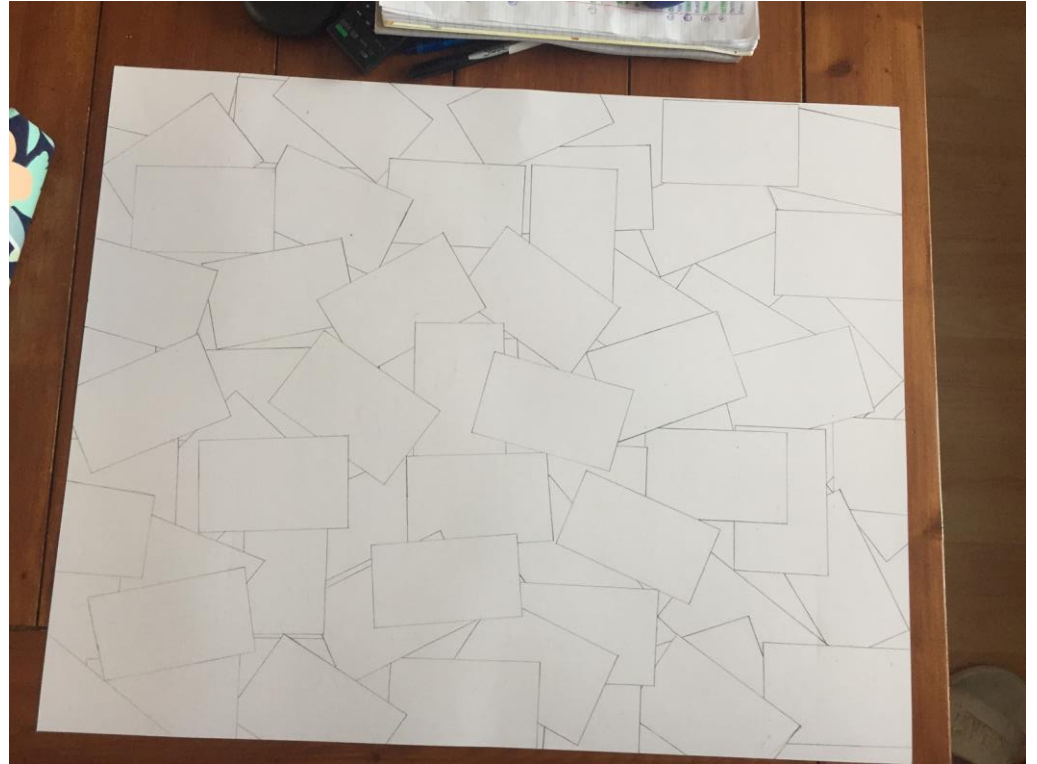
The Process Of Making My Poster For The Harmony Day Challenge

Outline flags in lead

Using a lead pencil I outlined many rectangles on a 51x63cm page.

These are going to be used as the shape of my flags that I will draw on.



Draw and colour the flags

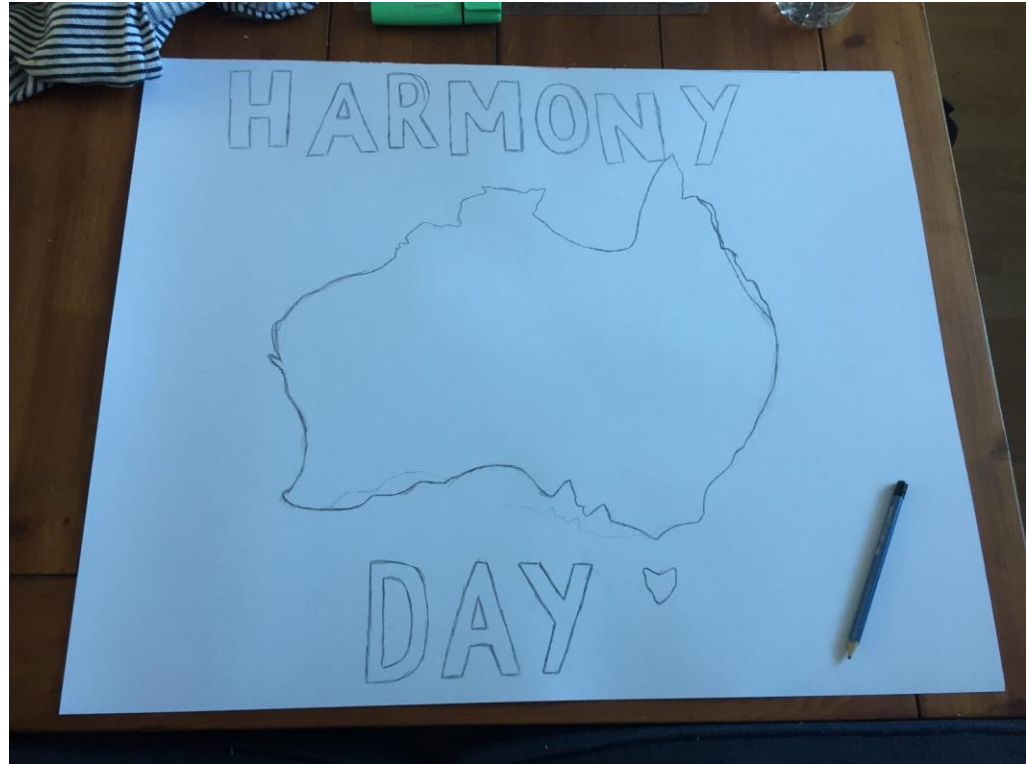
I used a lead pencil to draw the design of the flags into the rectangles then used a fine tip marker to go over the lead pencil.

Once I finished going over it I coloured it into the correct colours of the flags.



Draw Australia and “Harmony Day”

I then found an image on the internet and tried to draw it onto a second piece of 51x63cm paper and then I just wrote the words “Harmony Day” in bubble writing.



Cut out Australia and “Harmony Day”

I then carved out my Australia drawing
on the outline of it an I also did it to the
words “Harmony Day”.



Trace from the cutout

Using the piece of paper I drew Australia and “Harmony Day” on then cut out I traced it.

First I traced it in lead pencil, then a fine line pen and then finally with a Sharpie to make the lines more noticeable and make it stand out more.



And here is the final product.
