PIN number - (you received this in Term 2) required for accessing HSC Results and UAI by phone and for UAC application.

UAC issues 2 numbers

A PIN, which will be to you in August. This PIN enables you to make application to UAC.

UAC Student number - issued when you make your application to UAC and required for any further communication with UAC.

UOW Management Cadetship

The <u>University's Management Cadetship</u> provides an enriched study experience combining real life work experience with study in a great university. Cadets work in a number of areas across the University including Personnel, Finance, Marketing, Audit, Policy & Governance and Student Administration. Successful applicants undertake a relevant undergraduate degree majoring in areas such as Management, Marketing, Finance, Accounting or Business Information Systems. Other areas of study may be acceptable if they are considered compatible with the work placements of the cadetship, so enquire if you are unsure. Cadets receive an annual salary with increments each year, plus an education allowance covering course and student body fees and a book allowance. UOW First Year Accommodation Guarantee

From 2014, UOW is able to guarantee accommodation for students studying at the Wollongong campus.

With 360 new places now available in the student residences, there are a total of 1900 places in UOW managed accommodation. At the beginning of 2013, the new development at Kooloobong Village opened with 360 new beds in four bedroom, self-catered units and single studios. Located on campus, Kooloobong Village offers state of the art facilities, a games' room, meeting rooms, outdoor landscaped bbq areas and a diverse student community.

How do Students apply for Accommodation Guarantee?

Once UAC offers have been released, those offered a place at UOW will receive confirmation of their accommodation offer and information on how to accept it.

Students must accept the offer of accommodation within 72 hours of receiving it, otherwise the accommodation offer will lapse. Offers are sent via email so you MUST keep a close eye on your emails throughout December/January.

If you wish to be considered for guaranteed accommodation, you must <u>apply for accommodation</u> by the closing date of 31 October 2013. If you apply for accommodation after this date we are not able to guarantee accommodation - however, your application will still be considered on a first-come, first-served basis.



Robyn Elks from the Nepean s forum said around 6000 year 10 and 12 students from western Sydney attended the Nepean Careers Market last

Thursday and Friday.
"It is an excellent opportunity for students to examine the train ing and employment opportunit-ics available in the career that they are interested in," Ms Elks

"You get students who go along herause they have no idea what they want to do and they come away with something they can then look into further.

The careers marker featured NSW universities, TAFE colleges, private colleges, apprenticeship providers, exchange programs

and various other organisations. Year 12 St Dominic's College student Daniel Hill said it beneficial for students who have some idea about what they want to do after school and those who have no idea at all.

The University of Canberra is pleased to announce that the Principal's Recommendation Scheme will be offered to schools leavers again for 2014 entry. This scheme is an early entry initiative which provides current Year 12 School students with an opportunity to secure an offer to the University during the UAC early round in December.

The University of Canberra recognises that assessment by examination and an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) are not always the best measures of a student's ability or determination to succeed at university, therefore, if a principal recognises that a student has the aptitude to go on and succeed in higher education they can recommend them to the University to receive an offer.

Applicants are considered solely on the Principal's recommendation and no additional supporting materials are required. Students will be required however, to *nominate the listed course on their form as their first preference in their UAC application* before the closing date for the Early Entry Round in December. Please see Ms Elks for further details regarding the application process.
