Tax File Number Applications

As the year is drawing to an end, many students may be applying for work leading up to the Christmas break. If you are 13 years or older, you can apply for a Tax File Number (TFN) through school.

Tax File Number application forms are available from the Careers room and the front office.

When you return the completed form, your birth certificate or passport (if you were not born in Australia) must be sighted.

If you do require a Tax File Number before Christmas, you must complete and return your application to school by Wednesday, 19 November.

Applications submitted after this date will still be accepted but you may not receive your TFN before Christmas.

UWS: Badanami Alternative Entry Program for Indigenous Students Test Dates

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander high school and mature age students can apply to study at the University of Western Sydney through the Badanami Alternative Entry Program. The program is designed for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who have not:

- Completed high school
- Obtained an ATAR or high enough ATAR score for their chosen course
- Received sufficient workplace experience

Obtained a Higher School Certificate (HSC)

The Badanami Alternative Entry Program is a two day test held on the Kingswood (Penrith) campus. Students will be given an interview and tested on basic mathematics and English. Raising University Entry Standards for Future Teachers

From 2016, prospective students will need to meet increased academic standards to be offered a place in a NSW accredited undergraduate teaching degree.

From 2016, entrants to an accredited undergraduate teaching degree will need:

- a minimum of three Band 5 HSC results, including one in English or
- to complete bridging units equivalent to a minimum of three Band 5 HSC results, including English, as approved by BOSTES before entry or
- to enter via an alternative pathway as advised by their university and approved by BOSTES.
