SRS enables schools to recommend Year 12 students who are UAC applicants, for early offers of undergraduate admission. The aim of SRS is to help Year 12 students gain access to higher education, some of whom might otherwise not be offered a place. SRS, which will be operational for 2015 admissions onwards, aims to centralise the early admissions process. A diverse future with European Studies

Are you students interest in a career in communications, journalism, international law, business, international relations or the non-government sphere? Or maybe they want to go to Europe to study or work? Whatever their interests, taking up European Studies units within an Arts Degree at the University of Sydney will help them achieve their goals.

European Studies introduces students to the idea of Europe and the European Union, to European cultures and histories, and to contemporary society and culture. The focus is on current events. The units look at immigration, minorities and cultural conflict in Paris, Berlin, Moscow and other major cities, using gripping movies and interesting novels. Students explore European identity through engaging texts and examine the social effects of the economic crisis in Greece, Spain and Italy, the re-emergence of autoritarian traditions in Russia and Eastern Europe, German advances in ecology and the environment, and ethnicity and co-existence in the Balkans. Students will also discuss the European Union and the social and political forces both holding it together and pulling it apart.

The European Studies program is interdisciplinary, meaning that it looks at aspects of European life from a variety of perspectives. This allows students to tie European Studies in with their interests in history, economics, politics and the social sciences and literary and cultural studies. All material is taught in English and no language other than English is required.

Graduates in European Studies currently work in journalism, the media, television and advertising, government and nongovernment organisations, multinational business and education and training..

Logos for Schools

Logos is a philosophy programme for secondary students, delivered in two units; Philosophy and Ethics. Based on the University of Notre Dame Australia's Core Curriculum, the programme has been developed for Year 11 students who demonstrate an interest in philosophy and ethics. Through their participation in the programme students will develop their critical thinking and ethical decision making skills, while reflecting on their own personal experiences.

The programme consists of two units:

Logos I - Philosophy

Logos I introduces students to basic philosophical questions and arguments regarding the nature of thinking, reality, truth, and the human person spanning the entire history of the tradition of philosophy.

Logos II - Ethics

Students who choose to continue into Logos II will be introduced to the discipline of ethics, the key ethical theories (especially natural law theory, virtue ethics, and deontology), practical decision making, and moral evaluation.

Program Delivery

The first unit in Philosophy will run in the winter school holidays from 30 June until 4 July. The second unit in Ethics will run in the summer school holidays from 15 until 19 December. Students must successfully complete the unit in Philosophy before commencing the unit in Ethics.

Students who successfully complete the two units of the programme will be eligible to apply for advanced standing for two of the core curriculum units in any undergraduate degree offered by The University of Notre Dame Australia.

Engineering and Technology Cadetships (ETCAD)

The Engineering & Technology Cadetships (ETCAD) Program was launched in 2013 by Professional Cadetships Australia, an Australian company that has a proven record of placing Year 12 students with leading companies.

Under the 2013 Program, Engineering Cadets were placed at Rolls-Royce in the Naval Marine business and Technology Cadets were placed at Westpac in Group Technology.

In 2014, there are again opportunities for Year 12 students to apply for placement at Westpac.

Technology Cadets combine work at the Westpac Group in Sydney city with university study in computer science, information technology or information systems. Alternatively, cadets may undertake a commerce or arts degree and select information systems as one of their majors. Technology Cadets study part-time at the university of their choice in Sydney. Cadets work at Westpac for six months each year and study in the other semester. It is possible that a second company may offer Technology Cadets ships in 2014. Watch this website for updates.

Engineering Cadets - Currently there are no Engineering Cadetships being offered in 2014 but if a company does join the ETCAD Program, details will be uploaded to the ETCAD website.

To be considered for a Cadetship under the ETCAD Program, you will need to expect an ATAR of at least 86.25 (or an IB Diploma score of at least 31).

If you have applied for a Business Cadetship and are interested in technology, you may also wish to apply for a Technology Cadetship under the ETCAD Program.


