#### **Teacher Education Scholarships**

Up to 300 scholarships are available to students wishing to train as teachers in subject areas of workforce need (mathematics, physics, English, special education or selected technological and applied studies

subjects). These scholarships provide financial assistance to students while they are studying and secure employment as a teacher in NSW public schools on completion of their studies.

#### **Teacher Education Scholarships for Aboriginal people**

Up to 80 of these scholarships are exclusively available for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander students to train as teachers in primary or any secondary subject.

## **Great Teaching, Inspired Learning Cadetships**



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## <u>Laing + Simmons Real Estate Scholarship Program</u>

This program is for Year 12 individuals wishing to enter the real estate industry.

- ⇒ Three scholarships will be offered in 2015 and will comprise of:
