The University of Sydney Indigenous Australian Engineering Summer School (IAESS)

From the 11 to 17 January 2015, the Faculty of Engineering and Information Technologies at The University of Sydney will be hosting the Indigenous Australian Engineering Summer School, funded by Engineering Aid Australia.

The IAESS Program gives 20 Indigenous high school students from across Australia who are entering years 11 and 12 in 2015, the opportunity to come to Sydney and explore the possibilities of studying and working within various areas of engineering.

The IAESS Program is fully sponsored with all activities, accommodation, flights and meals covered by Engineering Aid Australia and The University of Sydney.

The week-long program will involve site visits at key Sydney locations, curriculum exercises and participation in cultural activities. Further highlights include networking opportunities with engineering industry representatives and the Sydney Harbour Bridge Climb.

Diploma in Law

The Diploma in Law is awarded by the Legal Profession Admission Board which is the authority that grants admission to the legal profession in NSW. For the purpose of admission to the legal profession, the Diploma in Law and a law degree from an accredited faculty equivalent. Based on current fees for tuition and examination, it is possible to complete the Diploma for less than \$15,000.

The Board's aim in offering the Diploma is to make the study of law accessible and affordable to as many people as possible who have the desire and the necessary aptitude to undertake it. Notable features of the program are:

- Entry to the course is open to holders of a NSW HSC with an ATAR of at least 68.90;
- The course is designed to be taken part time (all week day lectures are delivered in the evening) or by external study. Lectures are delivered at Sydney University's Camperdown Campus;
- The course has a practical orientation and emphasis in the course is on preparation for practice;
- Teaching staff come from law faculties and legal practice. All teach part time for the Law Extension Committee, so we cannot offer the level of individual support available from full time academic faculties;
- There is no HECS available, although some students may qualify for Austudy assistance;
- Students have full access to the Sydney University Law School Library.

There are 1,200 students presently enrolled in the course of whom about 10% entered through the HSC or equivalent entry category, often after some time in the workforce.

Applying for study in 2014-15 New phone numbers for UAC

Applications for tertiary study in 2014-15 will open on Wednesday 6 August and the UAC 2014-15 Guide, listing more than 1,800 courses on offer from 29 participating institutions and 12 apply direct institutions, should have already arrived at NSW and ACT high schools and newspapers. The Guide has information about every course and, with year-round admissions, students are encouraged to check UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/course-search/ for course updates and additions.

The colourful cover artwork for this year's Guide has once again been selected from ARTEXPRESS and features a photo media work by Ariel Mekler-Peled from Moriah College called Coloursism.

The processing charge for on-time applications this year is \$29 for Year 12 applicants and \$62 for non-Year 12 applicants. Remember to remind your students to apply by the on-time closing date of Tuesday 30 September 2014. After that date, higher processing charges apply. See the back cover of this issue for a full list of UAC key dates for 2014-15 admissions.

The 2014-15 International booklet

The UAC 2014-15 international booklet is for international students who will complete an Australian Year 12 qualification in Australia or overseas, an International Baccalaureate (IB), or a New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Level 3 in 2014. The booklet lists international fee-paying courses offered by UAC's participating institutions for these students. There are more than 1,300 courses available from 24 institutions. The processing charge for 2014-15 international applicants is \$70.

The booklet will be delivered to schools in NSW in August and will contain all the information needed to help these students apply for uni. Applications open on Wednesday 6 August. For more information, visit UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au/international/

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS)

The Schools Recommendation Scheme booklet for Year 12 students is now available to download at www.uac.edu.au/srs/ and will be available to schools in hard copy in the next couple of weeks.

UAC has emailed school principals to let them know that school data has been loaded to SRS Schools and they can complete Step 3, the final step of SRS registration. The Registration fact sheet, available at www.uac.edu.au/srs/schools/ describes Step 3 in detail.

Registration can be completed via the SRS Schools principal's login at www.uac.edu.au/srs/schools/. Updated and additional fact sheets are also available from this webpage.

Enquiry line

UAC has a new enquiry line for 2014-15 admissions. **1300 ASK UAC (1300 275 822)** is the new number for contacting UAC. However, calls to the previous number (02) 9752 0200 will still go through to the customer service area.

ATAR enquiry centre

UAC's ATAR Enquiry Centre also has a new number this year. **1300 MY ATAR (1300 692 827)** is the new number for anyone with enquiries about their ATAR. However, calls to the previous number (02) 8736 5900 will still go through to the Enquiry Centre. The ATAR Enquiry Centre will be open from Thursday 18 December until Wednesday 31 December 2014.

Educational Access Schemes (EAS)

EAS applications open on Wednesday 6 August 2014. The 2014-15 Educational Access Schemes booklet, including the application form, will be delivered to schools in August. It will also be available to download from UAC's website from Wednesday 6 August at www.uac.edu.au/eas/. On-time applications close on Tuesday 30 September 2014, however EAS applications can be submitted until Wednesday 7 January 2015 for consideration in the Main Round. Students who submit their EAS application before Friday 28 November will receive their EAS eligibility letter by Tuesday 23 December 2014 - in time to change their preferences for the Main Round.

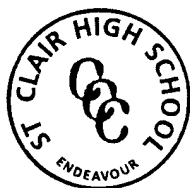

Equity Scholarships

Equity Scholarships help financially disadvantaged students with the costs associated with higher education. Students apply online for an Equity Scholarship through UAC. Applications open Wednesday 6 August.

The 2014-15 Equity Scholarships booklet will be delivered to schools in August. It will also be available to download from UAC's website from Wednesday 6 August at www.uac.edu.au/equity/.

The on-time closing date is Tuesday 30 September 2014. Applications and all associated supporting documentation must be received at UAC by Wednesday 7 January 2015 to be considered for the Main Round.

Keep those contact details correct

UAC needs to have the correct contact details for applicants so that we can provide important information in a timely manner.

Remind your students to keep their contact details up-to-date. If details change after they have applied, all they need to do is go to Check & Change on UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/check-change/ to update them.

Do your students need to sit the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT)?

The Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) is designed to assess a range of competencies considered important for success in tertiary study. STAT is used by many institutions as part of their admissions procedure for some courses and certain categories of applicants.

While STAT is not generally used for Year 12 students, the one specific course where Year 12 students must sit STAT is Veterinary Science at the University of Sydney. (Students no longer need to sit STAT for Pharmacy at University of Sydney.)

STAT candidates must register through UAC. Registrations for candidates wishing to study in 2015 open on Wednesday 6 August, with a number of test sittings held between September 2014 and January 2015. For more information, visit www.uac.edu.au/stat/.

Remind your students who have sat STAT and/or the Undergraduate Medicine and Health Sciences Admission Test (UMAT) that they need to include their candidate number in their UAC application.

UAC and applicant privacy

Many parents call us regarding their son or daughter's application, but unless they have been named on the application as an agent, we are unable to discuss details of the application with them due to privacy restrictions.

To nominate an authorised agent, students need to complete the appropriate section in their application, or submit a letter of authority to UAC. This authorisation only applies to the UAC application process; it does not authorise someone to accept an offer on the student's behalf. See UAC's website for further information.

Remind your students about UAC PINs

NSW HSC and ACT Year 12 students will be issued with a four-digit UAC PIN which they will receive in the mail in early August. They will need it to apply, so remind them to keep it in a secure place.

UAC receives many calls about UAC PINs that don't work. Remind students to check they are using their UAC PIN, and not their HSC PIN issued by the NSW Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards before they contact us.

1. **Apply directly through UAC by 31 October 2014** - All students across Australia must apply through UAC at www.uac.edu.au and include either B Midwifery - Callaghan (UAC code 483400) or B Midwifery - Port Macquarie (UAC code 483410) among your preferences.
2. **Register to attend a Personal Qualities Assessment (PQA) by 7 November 2014** and sit the assessment on a nominated date. The cost of completing this assessment is \$75 per applicant.
3. **Apply directly to UON by 5 December 2014** - You must complete an application form nominating your preference for clinical placement location.

Selection of applicants will be made on the basis of their PQA and academic performance, together with their stated clinical placement preference.

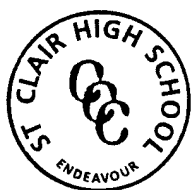

UAC – what we do

The Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) is the central office that processes applications for undergraduate courses, postgraduate courses, Education Access Schemes and Equity Scholarships and Schools Recommendation Schemes. UAC also notifies NSW HSC students of their ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank).

Applying through UAC is easier than applying separately to each participating institution. UAC co-ordinates the process, and posts notification of offers on behalf of the institutions. However, the institutions, not UAC, decide who receives an offer.

UAC's website features a list of its 29 participating institutions at www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/institutions/. Section 2 in Part 1 of the UAC 2014–15 Guide also contains a list of the institutions, with more detailed information about each institution in Part 2.

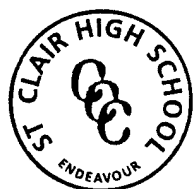

Year 12 checklist for applying through UAC

Have you researched the courses available? ✓

There are over 1,400 courses available for 2014-15 admissions via UAC. You can research the courses available using Table 1 and the course descriptions in the UAC 2014-15 Guide. The information in this Guide is accurate as at publication in July 2014. For course changes since publication, visit www.uac.edu.au/undergraduate/course-search/.

Do you know your UAC PIN? ✓

Your UAC Personal Identification Number (PIN) is your key to applying through UAC and accessing information about your application.

This four digit number also allows you to access information such as your course preferences, offers and your ATAR from UAC's website.

Considering how important this number is – and that it can take time to re-issue it if you lose or forget it – remember to keep your UAC PIN in a secure place.

What is your UAC PIN?

If you are attending the 2014 NSW HSC or the 2014 AOT Year 12, you are issued with your four-digit UAC PIN in the mail in early August. For all other applicants, your UAC PIN is the first four digits of your date of birth – for example, if your birthday is 17 May, your UAC PIN is 1705.

What if my UAC PIN doesn't work?

If your UAC PIN doesn't work, check that you are trying to use the correct number. NSW students – check that you are using your UAC PIN not the PIN issued to you by the NSW Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards (BOSTES).

If you are using the correct PIN and are still experiencing difficulties, call UAC on (02) 9752 0200.

Lost or forgotten UAC PINs

If you have applied through UAC you can use Check & Change on UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au to have your UAC PIN re-issued.

If you have not yet applied, you can have your UAC PIN re-issued by calling UAC on (02) 9752 0200. You will be asked some identification questions. If your details match our database you will be re-issued with your UAC PIN over the telephone. If they do not match, you will be asked to write to UAC requesting your UAC PIN be re-issued, or you can come to UAC in person.

Changing your UAC PIN

After you have applied, you can change your UAC PIN using Check & Change on UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au. Note that your UAC PIN must contain four numeric characters.

Have you provided a current and correct email address? ✓

It is very important that UAC has a current and correct email address because you will be notified by email about any correspondence we send to you, including any offer of admission.

You can change your contact details using Check & Change on UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au.

Have you moved? ✓

It is important that you provide UAC with an up-to-date address and telephone number so we can easily contact you – and ensure you receive your UAC PIN, which allows you to apply and access information such as your course preferences, offers and ATAR.

You can change your address after applying:

- via Check & Change on UAC's website at www.uac.edu.au
- by writing to UAC.

Telephone, email and fax requests will not be accepted by UAC for security reasons.

You must also separately notify the NSW Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards (BOSTES) of your new address. To change your address with BOSTES, write a letter to: BOSTES, Attention: Records, GPO Box 5300, Sydney 2001.

You must include your full name, student number, school, former address and new address.

Do you need to provide supplementary information? ✓

Some 2014 Year 12 students may need to submit supplementary information as part of their application. When you apply make sure you read the instructions carefully to see whether you need to provide additional information or undertake further tasks (registering SITAT).

Do you need someone to act on your behalf? ✓

- If you wish to authorise someone to act on your behalf, you can do this by:
- completing the relevant section when you apply
 - providing a letter that authorises someone to act on your behalf.

The letter must contain your UAC application number, your full name and signature, and the full name and signature of the person authorised to act on your behalf.

If you are travelling interstate or overseas, remember to take a copy of the UAC 2014-15 Guide, your UAC application number and your UAC PIN with you.

Note: This authorisation only applies to the UAC application process. It does not authorise someone to accept an offer on your behalf. For details on how to authorise someone to accept an offer on your behalf, contact the relevant institution.

Are you an international student? ✓

If you are an international student studying a 2014 Australian Year 12, either in Australia or offshore, an International Baccalaureate or a New Zealand National Certificate of Education Achievement (NCEA) Level 3 in 2014, then you'll need a copy of the UAC 2014-15 International booklet.

The booklet will help you apply through UAC for study in 2014 and 2015. See your careers adviser to obtain your copy.

Schools Recommendation Schemes

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) are one way institutions make early offers to current Australian Year 12 students who have applied for undergraduate admission through UAC.

SRS aim to facilitate access to higher education for current Australian Year 12 students who might otherwise not be offered a place. SRS applications are assessed centrally at UAC, using school recommendations and your Year 12 academic achievements.

Educational Access Schemes

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) are designed to help provide access to university for students who have experienced long term educational disadvantage beyond their control or choosing, such as disrupted schooling, financial hardship, personal illness/disability and home environment and responsibilities.

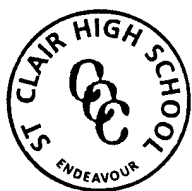

Important Changes to TAFE NSW for 2015

The NSW Government is making significant changes to its vocational education and training system. These changes are known as the *Smart and Skilled* reforms and include a Skills List which identifies qualifications which will be subsidised by the government.

From 1 January 2015 TAFE NSW, like all Registered Training Organisations, will implement the Smart and Skilled reforms. These reforms will affect you as a new or continuing student into 2015.

TAFE NSW students who enrol and study in fee for service courses are not affected by the Smart and Skilled reforms.

If you are a student of TAFE NSW in Semester 2, 2014

Until 31 December 2014, you can continue to enrol and study in government subsidised courses, if you live or work in NSW and meet the current eligibility conditions. You will pay the relevant 2014 TAFE NSW Fee.

If you are a student of TAFE NSW in Semester 2, 2014 and continuing into 2015

If you are a student of TAFE NSW in Semester 2, 2014, enrolled in a 2014 Skills List course and continuing this course into 2015, you will pay pro-rata *Smart and Skilled* fees in 2015 to complete your qualification. Concessions and exemptions will be available to students who meet eligibility criteria.

If you are a student of TAFE NSW in Semester 2, 2014, enrolled in a non-Skills List course and continuing this course into 2015, you will be required to pay a fee for service in 2015 to complete your qualification.

As a new student of TAFE NSW in 2015

From 1 January 2015, if you wish to enrol in a new 2015 Skills List government subsidised course the new *Smart and Skilled* fee structure will apply and you will need to meet eligibility requirements to access these subsidised training places.

Concessions and exemptions are available to students who meet eligibility criteria. VET FEE HELP loans will also be available for government subsidised diploma, advanced diploma, and specific certificate IV courses.

If you wish to enrol in a non-Skills List course, these are offered as fee for service courses. You may be able to access a VET FEE HELP student loan.

Where to from here

TAFE NSW will continue to provide you with a wide range of courses at a consistently high standard to ensure the best outcome for your career.

Our staff are available to advise and guide you through the changes to the fee structure and how this might affect you in 2015. Information is also available on the TAFE NSW website.

In October 2014, TAFE NSW will advertise the Skills List courses and fees we will be offering for 2015. Fee for service courses will be advertised earlier than the Skills List courses.
