# **DEPUTY PRINCIPAL REPORT**

# Subject Selection for Year 10 for the senior years 2021-2022

Adaptability is the key these days. Therefore, subject selection for Year 10 for the senior years needs to be done differently. Unable to have an information evening for parents and students in line with Covid restrictions, we now have on-line videos from each head teacher, from Mrs Bennett and myself outlining important information on the HSC and ATAR requirements, HSC course descriptions and a process to complete selections. This information will be available at the beginning of Term3. I know that you will find these resources informative. We will be supplementing this information with a hard copy booklet which will be distributed in Term 3 Week 1. The booklet will also be available on the school's website which can be downloaded in its entire form.

As with previous years, we will be continuing with the one-on-one interviews for each Year 10 student. This is an essential part of our subject selection process, we believe, ensuring that each student has a personalised conversation to check compliance with NESA rules as well as to ensure thatstudents have understood course requirements and all options available. I'm certainly looking forward to seeing students grapple with the problem- solving necessary to select what they like, what they are good at and what will advantage them in their career pursuits.

# Year 8 subject selection for electives in Year 9 and 10

Students in Year 8 will be selecting 2 electives for study in year 9 2021 and Year 10 2022. Again, we will need to do things differently, so much of the information will be communicated on-line. We will inform you of this next term but please be assured there will be clarity and transparency with plenty of people available should there be any questions or issues.

# Semester 1 reports: Year 7 - 11

Students received their semester 1 report on Monday 29 June 2020. If your child was absent please contact the front office to organise alternative arrangements for collection.

Parent teacher evening was held on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 2020. This year St Clair High School has moved to an online booking system; however, restrictions were in place for interviews in line with Covid guidelines. # Uniform

The colder weather has led to students wearing their winter uniform. The line up at the uniform shop on Tuesdays has indicated to us that students are endeavouring to be in the correct uniform and parents have recently been sent a letter re-minding them of uniform requirements. Students are reminded regularly of the uniform requirements and of the procedures if they are out of uniform. Junior students should wear a maroon fleecy top and maroon micro fibre pants during winter. Senior students should wear grey long pants and a grey fleecy top during winter. If a student is unable to be in correct uniform a note from home is to be provided with a reason. Students will be given a uniform pass for the day. Students who do not follow process will be issued with a detention.

#### Year 11 HSC Success Plans

During Term 2 all Year 11 students took part in a session where each they sat down individually with a member of staff in order to develop a personalised HSC plan. The aim of this exercise is to set goals for the remainder of their schooling and then develop and discuss strategies on how each student can best achieve them. Mentor teachers provided personalised guidance and encouraged students to think about where they are currently at in terms of their learning and what they might need to do in order to get closer to their goals. This will be revisited next term for each student ensuring that they are on the right path to their success.

# Year 11 Get-Set Day

Following on from the Success Plan interviews Year 11 then participated in the Get-Set Day. The day was planned to supplement work being done in the classroom. The aim of the day was to empower students and set goals for the remainder of their schooling and develop strategies on how they can best achieve them. The day began with a motivational speaker who presented a session on being the 'Leader of your Life'. He spoke about the importance of knowing and valuing who we are and encouraging students to make decisions based on their own values.

Following this, students then attended a number of workshops presented by teachers. These workshops focussed on careers, study tips, healthy lifestyle and writing in the HSC. With this information students are encouraged to implement the strategies into their plans.

# **ABORIGINAL EDUCATION REPORT**

Despite COVID 19 having a significant impact on the way we would normally operate; I am very pleased to share that we have successfully continued to support and meet the individual learning and wellbeing needs of our students during remote learning and have proudly celebrated a range of significant cultural events such as Sorry Day, Reconciliation Week & NAIDOC Week.



During Week 4, in preparation for National Sorry Day held on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> May. Students engaged in a Teaching and Learning session on the significance of National Sorry Day. Our students learnt that National Sorry Day is a very culturally significant day where all Australians are reminded to reflect on and acknowledge the sad and painful history and continued effect of past government policies that forced the removal of Indigenous children from their families, communities and culture, resulting in the Stolen Generations.

#### National Reconciliation Week



National Reconciliation Week is held in the week following National Sorry Day (27<sup>th</sup> May – 3<sup>rd</sup> June). Reconciliation Week invites all Australians to grow respectful relationships and partnerships in the spirit of reconciliation. The theme for the 2020 Reconciliation Week was 'In This Together'. Whilst this year's theme resonated with us in more ways that could have been foreseen when announced in 2019, it reminded us that All Australians, whether in a crisis or in the process of reconciliation are all 'In This Together'. During Week 5, students were provided with a range of resources to explore Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and achievements during remote learning.

#### NAIDOC WEEK



Next week is traditionally NAIDOC week. Whilst community celebrations have been postponed to 8<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> November, SCHS will still be celebrating the history, culture and achievements of our Nation's First People, the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people through a range of activities throughout the week. Our Student Aboriginal Leadership Team will also be holding a fundraising BBQ on Friday the last day of term to raise funds for a culturally significant project. They will be selling:
